- >> Recommended content for demonstrating your value through a presentation
 - 1. Present examples of current contracts that have VBP language that has proven to be reasonable and achievable.
 - 2. Demonstrate mechanisms for using a VBP payment to address health equity and social determinants of health (SDOH) such as:
 - Adding community health workers to integrated are services
 - Contracting with community-based services in VBP models
 - Employing cost savings to address food insecurity and transportation needs.
 - 3. Outline clinical practices that have produced measurable outcomes supported by data that demonstrates the progress made by both the client and/or program.

RECOMMENDED CONTENT FOR DEMONSTRATING YOUR VALUE THROUGH A PRESENTATION

- >> Present a multi-year plan with year-over-year increase in risk.
- Suggest contract language to the payer that demonstrates increased risk over time with parameters to measure achievement.
- Detail and provide examples of how your electronic medical record (EMR) and other information system collect needed data and how it is analyzed.
- Describe how your clinical practices are aligned standards and have measurables outcomes.
- >> Define the process for continuous monitoring of VBP and its objectives.
